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To Whom It May Concern:

I am a dermatologist who has been in the field for more than 30 years. As a dermatologist I value and appreciate the need for good lighting (artificial or natural) in my profession.

Examining patients for diseases of the skin can be very difficult without the right light. Rashes can be very subtle and pigmented lesions frequently are variegated. It was about fifteen years ago when I came across a Promolux lamp that resolved these issues. I would like to share this information with colleagues as I am sure that they will welcome this lamp in their clinics and offices.

Even with the expert eye of a dermatologist, it could be easy to miss seeing a spot or a rash on the patients' skin under the wrong light. This has always been a great difficulty for those of us in the profession.

We always do our utmost to obtain offices with plenty of natural light as well as installing additional lamps and lighting fixtures in the ceiling and sometimes we need the use of special flash lights in an attempt to improve the lighting conditions.

We frequently do photography and having these lamps offer more flexibility and accuracy/fidelity than a flash or other artificial lights.
